- AP Scholar:** granted to students who receive scores of **3** or higher on **three** or more AP Exams.
- AP Scholar w/ Honors:** granted to students who receive an **average** score of at least **3.25** on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on **four** or more exams.
- AP Scholar w/ Distinction:** granted to students who receive an **average** score of at least **3.5** on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on **five** or more exams.
